Examen/Confession

Lord, forgive us for the things we do that hurt you and other people. Because you always love us, help us to love each other.

Bless the Lord who forgives all of our sins His love endures forever.

*Optional --- Adults and children appropriately share ways they have hurt God and other people that week. Ask forgiveness if fitting.

Gospel Reading

Summary: Many people followed Jesus as he taught about the kingdom of God and healed the sick. Jesus miraculously provided food for them when they were hungry. This reminds us of how God provided manna for His people in the wilderness. Like them, we are God's people because we follow Jesus. He provides for us, even when things seem impossible. We can be like Jesus by providing things that others need.

Luke 9:10-17

10 When the apostles returned, they reported to Jesus what they had done. Then he took them with him and they withdrew by themselves to a town called Bethsaida, 11 but the crowds learned about it and followed him. He welcomed them and spoke to them about the kingdom of God, and healed those who needed healing.

12 Late in the afternoon the Twelve came to him and said, "Send the crowd away so they can go to the surrounding villages and countryside and find food and lodging, because we are in a remote place here."

13 He replied, "You give them something to eat."

They answered, "We have only five loaves of bread and two fish—unless we go and buy food for all this crowd." 14 (About five thousand men were there.)

But he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty each." 15 The disciples did so, and everyone sat down. 16 Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke them. Then he gave them to the disciples to distribute to the people. 17 They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over.

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ

Day 1 - Read, then imagine and have kids act it out.

Day 2 - How does this passage connect to the OT or whole biblical narrative? Why is bread so important in the Bible? Why does Jesus tell us to ask God to, "...give us this day our daily bread?" What else, besides food, do we need to survive? What does Jesus mean when he says that, "I am the bread of Life?" What does this story teach us about the Lord's Table, Communion, or the Eucharist?

Day 3 - Talk about a piece of art associated with the passage.

<u>Jesus Multiplies Loaves and Fishes</u>, <u>Israelites Gathering Manna</u>, <u>Feeding of the 5000</u>

From there he will come to judge the living and the dead. Week Five

I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic church,

the communion of saints, Week Six

the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting. Amen. Week Seven

Day 1 - Adult offers a short prayer of dedication.

Day 2 - Adult provides prompts (ie. Pray for family, friends, city, those who are sad), kids can offer a word or sentence of prayer after each prompt.

Day 3 - A child or children pray.
