Opening Words

Gospel Reading

Luke 23:33-34, 39-43 (NIV)

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left.

Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing."

One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!"

But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation?

And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong."

Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ

Day 1 - Read, then imagine and have kids act it out this passage? How many characters do we read about in this passage? How do they react to Jesus?

Day 2 - Who does Jesus forgive in this passage? How does Jesus demonstrate love? How does the criminal next to Jesus show that he has faith?

Day 3 - Discuss the question: What does it mean to forgive others in the same way that Jesus has forgiven us? Can you think of a time it has been hard for you to forgive others?

Profession of Faith (Philippians 2:5-11)

*For memorization: Add one section each week

5 In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

6 Who, being in very nature God,

did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;

7 rather, he made himself nothing

by taking the very nature of a servant,

being made in human likeness. Week 1

8 And being found in appearance as a man,

he humbled himself

by becoming obedient to death— $\,$

even death on a cross!

9 Therefore God exalted him to the highest place

and gave him the name that is above every name, Week 2

10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow,

in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

11 and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord,

to the glory of God the Father. Week 3
